Introduction about the project

The Telangana State Biodiversity Board is implementing UNEP-GEF-MoEF&CC-ABS Project title -"Strengthening the Implementation of the Biological Diversity Act and Rules with focus on its Access and Benefit Sharing Provisions". The GEF project on ABS is the first ever global project - a programmme to access genetic resources, assess their economic value and share the benefits arising out of them among the local people. The project aims to assess and quantify the economic value of biological resources at local, state and national levels using appropriate methodologies to determine benefit sharing which will help in better implementation of the Biological Diversity Act, 2002 and its Rules 2004.
